

Organizations (Orgs)

The Org Deck was based on the very 1st study guide I created for myself when preparing to become food safety certified. Why? Because it was one I had the most difficulty sorting out: which org did what & which were most important to food safety.

Orgs & agencies & their acronyms may be included in an exam question or answer.

There may be multiple cards for an organization. The repetition may help you remember.

- Cards pairing orgs & initials
- Cards matching orgs to their role.
- Cards to help differentiate between similar sounding orgs with the same words in their names.
- There is an additional Acronyms Deck for other food safety related practices & activities.

Card Key

At the bottom of some of the Org cards, you can see, underlined, whether it is

- national or local.
- a public/government agency or a private one
- has a major, moderate, or minor role in food safety

Note that is it NOT important to know whether it is major, moderate, or minor

- Those listed as moderate or minor indicates they do not play as influential role in food safety training as do the major orgs.
- A relatively unimportant agency could be listed as an answer option. Knowing what all the multiple-choice answers mean, may provide one more clue to choosing the best answer.
- These descriptors are based on my opinions & experience, not any formal designation.


